

FLIGHTS BETWEEN PUERTO NATALES AND ANTARCTICA

We welcomed the month of December together with National Geographic and Lindblad, receiving at Puerto Natales Airport the passengers of the Orion and Explorer cruise ships, who continue their extraordinary journey toward the White Continent.



During contingency periods (waiting times), passengers can enjoy some of the main attractions of Patagonia, such as visits to glaciers, nearby estancias, archaeological sites close to the city, and, of course, its main attraction, Torres del Paine National Park.

For this experience to be possible, a minimum weather window of approximately five and a half hours in Antarctica is required. This means that good runway conditions are needed to allow the aircraft to land and take off, as well as clear visibility. It also requires an aircraft adapted to extreme cold, advanced navigation systems, precise planning, and highly coordinated logistical support.
